Sentences

Write ten sentences using all of your vocabulary words. Be detailed, creative and make Sure your sentences show That you know what the words mean. Underline your vocabulary words in each sentence NO BABY SENTENCES!

Wanted Poster

Create a wanted poster for a person using ten of your vocabulary words. Describe the person's physical features, characteristics, hobbies, reason the person is wanted, where the person might be found or last seen. Don't forget the reward! Make sure you underline your vocabulary words.

Lost and Found

Create lost and found ads

for ten of your vocabulary words. Example: Found-An official and important looking briefcase on the cushion of a couch in the lobby of the Crabtree Marriot Hotel. Phone: 545-7415

Cartoon Strip

Create a cartoon strip using at least half of your vocabulary words. Try to think of a situation in which your characters would say many of the vocab words. Make sure your comic strip is colored and neat. Underline your vocabulary words.

Fortune Cookie Fun

Create fortune cookie sayings with ten of your vocabulary words.

Example-You will become a dedicated reader this year. You will meet your desired goal in reading this year.
